TALES FROM THE GALLIC FREIGHTER

After a month of relative inactivity the crew decided that 'press-ganging' was the order of the day. (Oh how he wept, but to no avail, the bitter sailors were well aware that on a long sea-voyage 'fresh meat' was as important as 'fresh fruit'!) Visiting the captain (in his rooms at the Old Boar) the first mate and the cook suggested another voyage: a final search for the North-West Passage. This was quite pointless since the captain was a doomed man; armless, legless, deaf, dumb, blind, insane and with lung cancer, (not really any use to anyone.) The crew, however remembered better days and wheeled him to the 'Gallic Freighter'. They set 'sail immediately, promising to pay for the repairs upon their return.

The winds were in their favour and the seas smiled on the Gallic crew as they sailed into the horizon. Repairs took some time, and the cook warned the mate not to do anything as stupid as that again! Upon their arrival in the New World, they set aside time to hunt down and co-habit with the Red Indians, a pastime these twisted lunatics found amusing! Bad news was at hand; the witch-doctor of the tribe informed the captain that the pain in his inerds was without doubt gallstones, tears ran down the gnarled face of that swarthy sea-dog as he contemplated the miserable condition his wracked body had fallen into. Before long the seafaring folk had to re-embrace the ocean but as a passing measure they infected the entire tribe with the 'clap' (just so as they would remember them.)

Finding the North-West passage blocked by pack-ice they cast anchor near the barren province of Nova Scotia. The first mate told the cabin-boy that since the N-W passage was blocked he'd have to settle for the young man's back passage instead. The cook was so upset that he hadn't been offered the 'first bite of the (young fella's) cherry' that he took the long-boat, rowed ashore and was never seen again! No-one missed him, he'd been an irritable bastard at the best of times!

As fate would have it a few weeks later another ship passed by the 'cruel' freighter and thinking the evil vessal to be uninhabited decided to board her. What these hardy sailors could not have known is that the crew of two were in the captain's cabin attempting to console him. Both of his nipples had fallen off and a large green patch had appeared near his buttocks. His screaming raised hell on earth and it distracted the mate and the young lad from their 'love-games'. They found the only way to keep the hideous, old brute quiet was to sing sea-shantys for him, his favourite was one that named each sailor who had ever served with him: '19 Men on a Dead man's chest'. How the captain used to laugh when the (now gay activist) young cabin-boy substituted the line "I had 'em all up the bum!" for the more traditional "Yo ho ho and a bottle of Rum"!

As the forward party (of two) from the other ship searched the Gallic Freighter they were horrified by the condition of the galleon, the average ghost-ship did not smell like this! Walking into the captain's quarters they were greeted by a tortured yell: "Eeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeeee." And that was the last thing they remembered for a long time! The cunning cabin-boy had heard their footsteps, got his trousers on (got the mate out) and hit the two intruders over the head with a box of Captain Birdseye's Fish fingers. The nearby ship abandoned the two sailors when they didn't return, concluding that the freighter must be possessed by an evil spirit!

When the two lads awoke and discovered their comrades to have abandoned them, they decided to throw in their lot with their captors. The cabin-boy was promoted to cook because of his quick thinking and he never let the two new recruits forget it continually harking on about 'getting on' and 'working your way up' (from the bottom). Everyone knew that his career was a classic example of nepotism in action!

The two new sailors were provided with nick-names: 'Big' for the tall one (obviously ordered to be look-out - he didn't even need to climb up to the crow's nest to do the job!) and 'Girl' for the effeminate one (as cabin-boy he would tend to the desires of the jaded crew!). And so a course was set and the Freighter set the sails, the far East was the destination and retribution was in the air!

The journey to Japan was uneventful, the mate as acting captain made Bligh look like a liberal, the cook delegated most of his work and the entire crew caught scurvey. The look-out kept to

himself, trusting in a low-profile which was rather hard considering his 6feet and 7inches. The cabin-boy stirred up a lot of trouble by rushing from one partner to another claiming that the former was better endowed than the latter! And as if he hadn't suffered enough the captain grew three double-chins and became terribly constipated, he had no relief for a month and grew to a hideous size before it started to leak out of his ears!

Docking in Tokyo harbour the strange crew of the Freighter went ashore, they were eager to spend their wages on geisha girls and the like. The mate, an avid film-goer wanted to catch some of Kenji Mizoguchi's unreleased porno ghost-films; he was stunned to see his old ship-mate the Scot acting in one of them. The vacation was short-lived: a Japanese doctor went aboard the Gallic Freighter to examine the captain. Discovering the old Pirate to have full-blown AIDS he put the entire ship and himself into quarantine. Realising that no 'fun' was to be had cooped up on board the mate set sail immediately, ordering the Japanese to serve as official log-keeper.

Days turned into weeks and the merry gang went on their way stopping here and there causing mayhem where ere they landed. The Captain grew progressively sicker and only cheered up slightly at the news that they were to return to North America to hunt down and punnish the Canadian ex-cook. It was at this point during their intrepid voyaging that the entire crew caught the notorious 'SnuffLeg' disease, each and everyone of the untrusted sailors had to have his left leg amputated. The Japanese doctor performed these operations mocking the crew with his Eastern salute (hand behind the ear). After chopping everyone on board he had to lose his own leg, disturbingly he did it one-handed, saluting all the time! Anaesthetics were not available so the vicious hounds took a slug of Rum and screamed their hearts out!

Can they sail a ship one-legged? Will the captain succumb to the vicious syndrome? Does the mate do a good Fletcher Christian impersonation? Will the cook ever admit he's a totally untalented dolt? Find out next year in 'Davy Jones' Locker'

10. Aug 88 - NOW






June 1984 - two oddities from The Lamb Gig


THE CHEXICON OF GLOVES

"1984 - THE POLITICAL YEAR"

The first two months of '84 were among the wierdest in the early history of Gaul. We decided to do some work; but to start with we read Lautreamont, Huysmans, Jarry, and 'Moby Dick', discovered Renoir's 'Boudu', lived by night and indulged ourselves with buckets of 'Wiz'. The last prag at Crossroads was notable for Ralph's version of 'My Generation'. And surprise,

March was a crux month - the miners went on strike and we started practicing at 313. (* Remember the P/A). The idea behind the band was to cross The Pop Group & The Fire Engines and to display our aural power by keeping the bass low and the treble high. (We have been looting the songs rehearsed during these sessions for the last five years!)

Realising that change was in the wind we decided to hitch up

surprise we started distributing anti-police bill leaflets!

with Martyn. [So Chris took a job at Fare-ways!] The new group was peculiar: we wrote loads of new songs but we had to take care because Martyn had hepatitus. (* I'm not drinking outta that cup!) On a lighter note Ralph & Chris took Martyn on one of their 'Brighton Runs' - he got bitten by a dog! Snooker was the craze of the moment and 'Fish' Salmon (acid casuality) and Bruce (back from Oz) made re-appearances. Then Ralph bought his 2-CV and suddenly I found myself 'sitting in' to and from rehearsals.

During June, Asterix and the Gauls made their live comeback (after 3 years) at the Lamb in Malvern. Perhaps five different posters was slightly excessive (* Do you think these people know what schizophrenia is?) And Dave Bangham began his illustrious career as a roadie. At the end of July we found ourselves back in the studio where we cut the 'Babes in the Wood' tape, which was later accompanied by Ralph, Chris and Neena's video. FACT: We split with Martyn because he didn't understand the fashion element of Kubrick's movie 'Barry Lyndon'.

In the autumn we delivered sandwiches in the City and met Emma. Thatcher and her cabinet got blown up and for five minutes we thought the revolution had started! Then it was time for the 3rd 'official' Gallic Holiday, Paris was our destination. An edition of De Sade was purchased and later stolen, wonder if that hitchhiker remembers us!

Musically we began writing what would later become 'Everything', auditioned Rose (eh?) and debuted our new act in Malvern at the Nags Head. In snatch form: a Raging Bull pep talk, Ralph as a waiter, Hammer & Sickle on the guitar, fights with the audience, Steve's dad alienated, posters no one would have on their shop-walls, Fatty Knight chided and Chris's tyres slashed, just a usual Gauls gig really!

All in all a positive year with a 'dark' side!
