
RICHARD MATTHEW BIFFA

Gallic FREEDOM FIGHTERS



1949-China. REVOLUTION - 1789-France. 1917-USSR. Overthrowing the state is not something that happens every day. First there's the assassinations/terrorism, then, if there is enough public support the mass-rioting/mutinies. The third stage is widespread Insurrection and then finally the 'Revolution' in it's full glory. Of course its not as simple as that but you get the idea! When Revolution does occur it's not exactly as people (ie Left-wing students) imagine. For one thing men/women of theory tend to get left behind as the people of action take control! It's one thing to condemn government murders, the inequalities of the class system, the viciousness of Capitalism - and quite another to take a gun and kill the perpetrators of these crimes! It is also worth bearing in mind that when Revolution does happen the effect is extraordinary. For instance after 1789 Europe was thrown into turmoil - both The Napoleonic Wars and the 1848 'attempted' Revolutions (and Marx??) were a direct result! 1917 inspired the German 1919 'debacle', The Spanish Civil War and still exerts it's influence on the world today. Mao's 1949 takeover inspired many South American and African communists. And the Iranian hardliners of 1978 have been the direct cause of the new Moslem 'Fundamentalism'. This short piece takes a look at the Baader-Meinhof Gang (West German Anarcho-Terrorists of the 60/70's), The IRA, The PLO and The Khalistan Commando Force. "Blessed are those who struggle".

THE BAADER-MEINHOF GANG Pt1 1968-72.

-"Let ten people meet who are resolved on the lightning of violence rather than the agony of survival."

(Raoul Vaneigem - 'The Revolution of Everyday Life')

-1965 Students march in West Berlin to protest at the US blanket-bombing of North Vietnam. The US embassy is attacked. Posters are put up: "FOR HOW MUCH LONGER WILL WE TOLERATE MASS MURDER COMMITTED IN OUR NAME?"

-1967 Summer - The state visit of the Shah of Iran to West Berlin. A series of demonstrations are brutally put down by the police and the Iranian secret service men - a 26 year old is shot by the police. Gudrun Ensslin (a demonstrator) is quoted as saying: "You know what kind of pigs we're up against. This is the Auschwitz generation. You can't argue with the people who made Auschwitz. They have weapons and we haven't. We must arm ourselves!"

-Andreas Baader meets Gudrun Ensslin during the Winter 67/68. (They become lovers).

1968.-April - Baader, Ensslin and two others plant a series of fire bombs in two big stores in Berlin. £250,000 of damage is caused, no-one is hurt. After a police tip-off the gang are arrested.

-11.April - Rudi Dutschke (leader of the Socialist students) is shot by a neo-fascist. In the riots that follow Ulrike Meinhof (a well-known left-wing journalist) is involved.

-Oct - Baader, Ensslin etc sentenced to 3 years for Arson. Their statement claims that the fire-bombs were started as a protest

at the indifference to the Vietnam War.



-31.Oct - 'The Battle of Tegeler Weg' - Students protesting at another court-case re. the April riots are joined by Rockers the worst street-fighting ever seen in the FDR ensues. 130 police injured (only 22 demonstrators.)

1969. - Apr-Nov - Baader and Ensslin out on appeal. Much of the

groundwork for their exploits are hatched.

-Nov - Their appeal is rejected. Baader and Ensslin go 'on the run'. By this time Horst Mahler (a successful Socialist lawyer) has also become involved.

1970.-April - Baader is arrested and re-imprisoned.

-May - Meinhof, Ensslin and others spring Baader from prison, one guard is injured. Money and accomadation are provided by the 'Schilli' (trendy lefties - lawyers, lecturers, progressive pastors etc).

-June - PLO training in the Middle East - Weapon use, 'real' military training - everyone is kitted out in combat gear except Andreas Baader who goes through basic training in skin-tight leather trousers.

-Sept - Back in Berlin they begin putting this training to good use with a series of bank-jobs and car thefts (they prefer to steal BMW's - Baader-Meinhof Wagons!)

-Oct - Mahler and two other members of the gang are arrested

by the police. A month later Jean-Carl Raspe joins.

-Dec - The name 'Red Army Faction'(RAF) is chosen because it stirs up memories of what the Soviet Red Army and the RAF and had done to Germany during the last War. Meinhof's "Urban Guerrilla Concept" communique detailed the guerrilla's aim thus: "to attack the state's apparatus of control at certain points and put them out of action, to destroy the myth of the system's omnipresence and invulnerability."

1971.-Jan - More Bank raids!

-10.Feb - Two gang members captured by the police.

-Socialist Patients Collective (SPK) — an extreme left-wing organisation of, group-therapy patients who believe that the sickness of the capitalist system is producing physically and psychologically disturbed people — the only cure: violent revolutionary change in society! Patients Info No 1' declares: "Comrades! There must be no therapeutic act which has not previously been clearly and uniquely shown to be a revolutioary act. The system has made us sick. Let us strike a death blow at the sick system." Contacts are made with the RAF.

 $-24.\mathrm{June}$ - Massive round-up of SPK members by the police - those not caught join the RAF.

-15.July - Two more RAF members cornered. Petra Schelm is shot and killed.

-25.Sept - Red Army Faction shoot and wound two policemen.

-Mid-Oct - Plans to kidnap US, Brit and French zone commanders of Berlin abandonned. Baader had wanted to use anti-aircraft

guns on a nearby police barracks as a diversion but they couldn't get hold of any! By this point he was supposedly using 'speed', drinking gallons of coffee and chain-smoking Gauloise.

-22.Oct - Policeman killed in shoot-out/Margrit Schiller captured.

-Dec - The police (with the aid of computers) and nationwide publicity campaign begin to make breakthroughs - intercepting mail/packages of weapons, discovering flats where gang members had been staying.

-4Dec - Police kill Georg Von Rauch (member of rival terrorist group 2 June Movement). 7000 protest in the streets of Berlin.

-22.Dec - Policeman killed during a bank raid. RAF blamed but the raid was later accredited to an SPK splinter group.

- 1972.-Feb Bomb explosion at British Yacht Club in West Berlin, a gesture of solidarity with the IRA.
- -1.March Police shoot dead a 17yr old because he doesn't stop his car when challenged. (He didn't have a licence!)
- -2.March Three gang members arrested, one killed/One policeman killed in shoot-out.
- -May US mine harbours in North Vietnam series of bombings planned in protest.
- -11.May Three bombs go off at a US Army base in Frankfurt 13 American soldiers injured, Lt.Col P.Bloomquist is killed.
 Estimated damage DM1 million. "West Berlin and West Germany
 will no longer be a safe hinterland for the strategists of
 extermination in Vietnam. They must know that their crimes
 against the Vietnamese people have made them new and bitter
 enemies, that there will be nowhere in the world left where
 they can be safe from the attacks of revolutionary guerrilla
 units... We demand the immediate end of the mine blockade of
 North Vietnam... We demand the complete withdrawal of American
 troops from Indochina... Victory to the Vietcong." (RAF
 Communique #1)
- -12.May More bombings 5 policemen injured.
- -15.May In protest at the strict isolation torture that RAF prisoners are being subjected to in prison a bomb intended for Judge Buddenburg is put in his car it cripples his wife.
- -19.May Two bombs go off in the Springer building in Hamburg; Seventeen people are injured. 3 warning telephone calls are ignored. "Springer would rather risk seeing his workers and clerical staff injured by bombs than risk losing a few hours' working time, which means profit, over a false alarm. To capitalists, profit is everything and the people who create it are dirt." (RAF Communique #4)
- -24.May 2 car-bombs explode outside a US barracks in Hiedleberg. Three American soldiers are killed, 5 wounded. "On monday, the foreign minister in Hanoi again accused the USA of bombarding densely populated areas in North Vietnam. In the last seven weeks the USAF has dropped more bombs over Vietnam than were dropped over Germany and Japan together in the whole of the Second World War." (RAF Communique #5).
- -1.June Police following a tip-off discover arms-cache. 5.50am Baader, Raspe and Holger Meins arrive in a car. Raspe stays outside on guard, he realises that the place is swarming with cops and makes a dash for it he is captured. The police surround the garage and a shoot-out ensues. The police throw tear-gas at them, Baader and Meins chuck it back. 7.45am Marksman shoots Baader in the leg. Within a few minutes Meins surrenders.

The police enter the garage and find Andreas Baader, lying bleeding (hair dyed blonde, dark glasses on) clutching his gun. They disarm him and drag him away still struggling! Holger Meins is severly beaten in police custody.

-7.June - Gudrun Ensslin is overpowered in a clothes-shop (the manageress had seen her gun while moving her jacket).

-15.June - Ulrike Meinhof and Gerhard Muller are arrested after a member of the 'Schilli' turn them in.

20 THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE IRA.

(1). The Rebellion of The United Irishmen in 1798 was led by a Protestant Lawyer Theobald Wolfe Tone. The Uprising was brutally crushed by the British. Tone committed suicide:

"To subvert the tyranny of our execrable government, to break the connection with England, the never failing source of all our political evils, and to assert the independence of my country—these were my objects. To unite the whole people of Ireland, to abolish the memory of all past dissensions, and to substitute the common name of Irishmen in place of the denomination of Protestant, Catholic and Dissenter—these were my means."

(2). The Fenian Brotherhood was founded in 1858 - there name was derived from the fian (the band of warriors) who attended the legendary Irish king Finn MacCool. Their motto "revolution sooner or never."

(3). Sinn Fein means 'Ourselves Alone'. Founded in 1905 by Arthur Griffith they believed that Ireland should sever all ties with Britain and stand or fall on it's own resources. Originally advocating passive resistance their views were heard through Griffith's newspaper 'The United Irishman'.

(4). The Easter Rising of 1916 was not immediately popular with the Irish population - the reason: the death of too many civilians. Figures: 220 civilans dead, 64 rebels and 134 Crown forces.

(5). Michael Collins, Commander of the IRA during the 1916-21 period was murdered by the IRA when he okayed the partition of the Isle.

(6). Eire was not soft on the IRA after independence - The 1931 Public Safety Act declared the IRA an illegal organisation. The 1939 Offences against the state Act introduced internment - 400

republicans were locked up during WW2 because the Irish government were scared that the IRA would try to make a deal with the Nazis (they tried but nothing came of it!)

(7). Between 1956 and 1962 there were 500 IRA incidents in Northern Ireland.... most of this was 'small beer' - in the six year period 18 people died (8 IRA, 4 Republicans and 6 members of the RUC).

(8). The grievances of the Catholics in the 1960's were justified: The constituencies in Catholic areas were heavily 'gerrymandered', out of N.Ireland's 84 legal officers 76 were Protestant, there were 6 Prot High Court Judges and 1 Catholic, of the 8 Crown solicitors none were Catholic and among the 21 trustees of the Ulster Folk Museum — the minority tradition was represented by a single Catholic. This sort of discrimination was widespread throughout the province!

(9). The first civilian killed during 'The Troubles' was Samuel Devenney (a 42 yr old Catholic from the Bogside district of Londonderry), he was kicked and beaten by the police during a civil rights sit-in on 19.4.69, he died of his injuries 3 months later. The first IRA man killed was Gerard McAuley (a 15 yr old member of the IRA youth section), shot by Protestants in Belfast.

(10). Gerry Adams joined the IRA in 1966 (both his grandfather and his father had been members), he was Belfast commander by 1972 (aged 23), instrumental with McGuinness in the creation of Northern Command in 1976 (previously the IRA had been controlled from Dublin!). Commander of the IRA in 1979 and elected MP for West Belfast in 1983. Martin McGuinness joined after the riots in 'Derry of 1968, he was commander of the Derry regiment by 1971 (aged 21) and overall commander of the IRA by 1977. At present he is a Sinn Fein councillor in Londonderry.

(11). At the beginning of the 'Troubles' in 1969, Irish Premier, Jack Lynch had prepared plans for the Irish army to invade County Derry & County Down but this was soon abandonned and for a short period a policy of turning a 'blind-eye' to gunrunning was adopted instead.

(12). The IRA split in 1969 - The Official IRA continued under the leadership of Cathal Goulding, the Provisional IRA (who were less into socialism, more into violence) were led by Sean MacStiofain. Adams & McGuinness joined the Provos.

(13). The CS (tear) gas used by the British army in 1969/70 is thought to have been instrumental in convincing many young Catholics to join the IRA - the tear-gas burnt the throat, stung the eyes with blinding tears and caused vomiting (sometimes for days!)

THE PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANISATION.

The PLO is an umbrella term, in as much as it seeks to represent the Palestinian diaspora as well as the Palestinians living in the occupied territories of the Palestine Bank (the West Bank) and the Palestinian Gaza (Gaza Strip). Within the grouping of the PLO are political movements of many persuasions as well as trade unionists. The largest movement within the PLO is 'fatah' (the opening) of which the well-known face of Yasser Arafat is the leader, they control about 80% through



membership. However, they are not the sole political voice. Other organisations include 'The Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine' (the PFLD), a moderate voice that ultimately does support Arafat's 'fatah' movement. It is a Damascus based group that owes it's political lineage to the Palestinian National Council (PNC) which is the Palestinian Government in exile. This group among others are under the auspices of the Syrian President Assad. There are many guerilla movements also represented in the PLO, the most prominent of which is the PLF (The Palestine Liberation Front) led by the controversial figure, Abu Abbas. In the past this group have been regarded as 'freedom fighters', and as such have propagated armed resistance against Israeli targets, probably the most famous of which has been the Achilles Lauro highjack.

Probably the most well known and certainly the most controversial group is the 'fatah Revolutionary command'. It's leader is the much feared Abu Nidal. However, contrary to most media reports, Nidal and his faction have never been members of the PLO. They are a break-away group that have challenged the structure of the PLO by continually attacking it's leader Arafat. In many of their attacks such as the bombing of Rome Airport (Christmas '84) they have called it in the name of the fatah but ' such statements are deemed invalid by the leaders of the PLO, as Nidal does not represent a political voice in the organisation. The two remaining forces under the umbrella, are both intellectual movements. The Communist party has been a long-time member of the organisation, although a relatively small one. However the final [Sorry, couldn't read it-Ed] movement, made up Palestinian poets, journalists and other academics, as well as the reasonably well-off play an important part. They are the thinktank of PLO policy, and the present stand of compromise adopted by the PLO, to a greater extent, may be attributed to this groups

armoury of reason and questioning.

The complexity of the organisation is much deeper, but what and who they represent is crystal clear. It is beyond doubt that the structure of the PLO as it stands, is the structure of the sole and legitimate representation of the Palestinian people. It is not merely a political or guerilla organisation, but more importantly it is the mouthpiece of all Palestinians everywhere in their struggle for self-determination.

A MODERN HISTORY OF PALESTINE.

1948. Declaration of the state of Israel; endorsed by the USA in UN; USSR & GB veto resolution. The only Palestinian strongholds in West Bank & Gaza. Palestinian 'resistance fighters' deported to neighbouring countries; Syria, Jordan, Lebanon & Egypt.

1967. 1st Arab/Israeli war, Israeli army with substantial military backing from USA & S.Africa beat back invading Arab forces; Israeli army occupy Neger desert in Egypt, West Bank & Gaza Strip in Palestine, Golan Heights in Jordan.

1973. Yom Kippur war, A short war in which Israelis push back further Arab

invasions.

1982. Israeli invasion of Lebanon; over 300,000 Lebenese civilians killed

during Israel's bombardment of major cities.

1983. Occupying Israeli army permit slaughter of tens of thousands of Palestinians in the refugee camps of Sabra & Chatilia, on the outskirts of Seirut; An inquiry is launched in Israel - Commander Areil Sharon is found responsible for the massacre and he is deposed from office (sacked!).

1384. Israel pulls troops out of Lebanon, leaving a 15-mile 'buffer-zone' in the south, controlled by the Israeli army, PLO leave Beirut 'triumphantly'

having resisted Israel's advance. Arafat is the last to leave.

1987. Due to Israeli repression of Palestinians, including torture and lack of self-determination in West Bank & Gaza Strip, Palestinian uprising begins

- 'Intifada' - stone-throwers against armed troops!

1988. Continued Israeli aggression against Lebanon culminating in Operation David: a military drive from the south to within 15 miles of Beirut. 'Intifada' continues - After I year of uprising: 300 Palestinians killed, 20,000 injured, 1000's in detention camps (6 deported to neighbouring states)... 6 Israeli soldiers killed!

Nov 1988. PNC declaration: PLO implicitly recognize the existance of Israel. They also renounce terrorism of all kinds. The Israeli govt renounce the declaration as a publicity stunt. USA refuse Arafat a visa to speak to UN, this leads to a condemnation of USA by all countries except GB & Israel (GB abstained); UN assembly move to Geneva to hear Arafat, Deadlock ensues as Israel rejects PLO and continues harsh treatment of Palestinians in uprisings.

THE BACKGROUND TO SIKH TERRORISM IN THE PUNJAB.

13.April 1919. The 'Jallianwala' Bagh massacre in Amritsar (British troops fire on a massive Sikh protest.)

1929. Mahatma Gandhi assure; that "after India has achieved political freedom, no constitution will be framed by the majority unless it is freely acceptable to the Sikhs."

1931. When asked what the Sikhs should do if they are betrayed, Gandhi replies: "In that case take their Kirpans (swords) in hand with perfect justification before God and man."

Sikh Resistance to the British. Figures: Martyrs 1550 out of 2125 (75%). Deportations during British rule 2147 out of 2646 (80%). Executions 92 out of 127 (80%). Sikhs make up 2% of the Indian population!

Nehru (1st Prime-Minister of India) said in 1945: "The brave Sikhs of Punjab are entitled to special consideration. I see nothing wrong in an area and a set up in the North wherein the Sikhs can also experience the glow of freedom."

During the partition of India the Sikhs suffered as the state of Punjab was split down the middle (half in Pakistan including the capital of Punjab — Lahore, half in India). Many Sikhs left Pakistan and walked to the new India as refugees.

1950. During the drafting of the Indian constitution Sikhs (along with Buddhists and Jains) are categorised as Hindus. All the personal laws of the Sikhs are abolished. Hindu laws are enforced. So much for what Gandhi said in 1929!

The reorganisation of state boundaries along cultural and linguistic lines is also intensely anti-Sikh. In 1966 Punjab is chopped in half again to create a Hindu speaking state, Haryana, which contains the new capital, Chandigarh (Punjabi is not taught in schools.) Punjab itself is deemed to be a bilingual state. (Due to anti-Sikh press hysteria thousands of Punjabi-speaking Hindus had denied that Punjabi was their mother-tongue—they had had to declare this in Punjabi because they couldn't speak a word of Hindi!) When Nehru was reminded of all the promises that had been broken his reply was simply that "the circumstances have now changed."

Discrimination against the Sikhs has been extraordinary: Electricity generated on the Punjab border costs more in Punjab than in the neighbouring states. The state of Punjab (unlike the others) is not in control of it's water supplies. There has been little or no aid from Delhi, the Indian government give as their reason for this that Punjab is one of the richest states. They do not however take into account the fact that after partition Punjab was a broken state and it is only through the hard work of the citizens that they have been able to achieve this wealth! There is an ancient link between the Sikhs and the Army. Since

the inception of the Khalsa they have considered themselves a martial race. Before independence Sikhs made up 60% of the volunteer Indian Liberation Army, now they are only allowed to provide 2% of the Armed Forces - This is a grave insult.

1973. The Anandpur Resolution. The 4 key demands were:

(1) The state-boundaries to be redrawn returning Chandigarh to Punjab. (2) Judicious determination of river water electricity disputes. (3) Greater autonomy for the states.

(4) Religious demands a. The right to broadcast Kirtan (hymns) from the Golden Temple to Sikhs living abroad, b. The redefining of Sikhs in the Constitution, c.Amritsar to be granted Holy city status like many other Hindu holy cities. The Indian govt do

nothing.

1982. The civil-rights campaign is officially launched, it is non-yiolent! The demand was for The Anandpur Resolution to be implemented. The agitation took the form of strikes and demonstrations. During the 2 years of the campaign over 200,000 Sikhs are arrested.

May 1984. The Sikh leadership announce plans to withhold the shipment of grain from the state. The Indian Govt seal off the

state and move in the army on a massive scale.

On June 4th 1984, a 16,000 strong contingent of the Indian army attacked the sacred Harmandir Sahib (Golden Temple) and cold bloodedly massacred thousands of innocent, unarmed pilgrims who had gathered to commemorate the martyrdom of Guru Arjan Dev Ji (a Sikh guru who gave his life in order to establish the principle that each individual should be able to pursue his own religious beliefs). The most sacred Sikh Shrine, the Akal Takhat, was destroyed and the Sikh historical reference (containing priceless original manuscripts) was burnt to the ground. The Indian army called 'Operation Bluestar' a glorious victory. They 'justified' the attack by claiming that "the extremists/terrorists led by Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale had collected men, arms, ammunition and explosives within the Golden Temple and had also made other preperations to wage war against the Government of India with the intention to establish a State independent of the Government of India to be known as Khalistan." This is unadulterated garbage. Sant Bhindranwale was a respected religious preacher, head of a missionary centre who had risen to prominence during the civil rights campaign. He had not spoken in favour of Khalistan. He had 100-140 followers with him in the temple equiped with WW2 303 rifles and some sten guns. The fact that a Sikh temple contained weapons is not unusual if one bears in mind the semi-martial nature of Sikhism. To his followers Bhindranwale was the epitome of their faith: a Saint-Soldier: "Even if it results in my body being cut

to small pieces, I shall still fight against injustice." After the slaughter Western journalists and Human Rights organisations were not allowed to enter The Punjab.

Five months later the Indian Premier Mrs Gandhi was murdered/executed by her own Sikh bodyguards. Within hours a major retaliation against the Sikhs was in progress. At least 10,000 Sikhs were murdered in Delhi alone (50,000 had their homes burnt down). This was a determined attempt at genocide — Men were butchered, women and young girls raped and children ripped apart. The Indian media blamed this on "Grief and Anger" at Mrs Gandhi's death. It was in fact the outcome of a well-organised and well-executed plan by important politicians in the Indian government. It is interesting to note that 80,000 troops were moved into Punjab in case there was any retaliation by the Sikhs there.

Since 1984 Punjab has been under martial law, the police have arrested enormous numbers of (often orthodox) Sikhs, held them (without trial), tortured and murdered them. The Indian media persist in spreading 'disinformation' about Sikh terrorists resulting in Western media coverage dealing purely with 'atrocities' - the bus killing etcetera. Khalistan (a seperate homeland) is an unlikely possibility but it is understandable that certain Sikh groups (Khalistan Commando Force in particular) should have taken up arms. In the words of Guru Gobind Singh (who laid down his own life for the Sikhs 300 years ago): "When all peaceful methods fail to ward off the enemy, It is righteous to unsheath the sword."




GP22 BRUITISM - THE LECKY SIDE.

Gallic Guide to healthy living No 5: Cocaine.

', , , don't get no kicks from cocaine but I get a kick out of you' - whoever wrote that was either a lunatic or had been sold talcum powder! For generations South American peasants have been supplementing their daily bread with something that provides virtually all the vitamins needed for healthy living. By simply chewing on the leaves of the coca plant they are able to give their bodies thiomine, riboflavin, vitamin C as well as ease their digestion and soothe their larynxs. By collecting these leaves, drying them and doing strange things with petrol and hydrochloric acid it is possible to obtain 'pasta' which can be mixed with tobacco or marijuana and smoked. If the pasta is treated with kerosene, methyl alcohol and sulphuric acid as well as a handfull of other chemicals it is transformed into virtually pure cocaine hydrochloride which is better known as Charles (a prince among drugs!), charlie, snow, toot, C or just plain coke (not to be confused with the soft drink even though the original Coca Cola had coke not caffeine as its main 'pep up' agent. Sadly few shops still stock that particular variety!).

Cocaine hydrochloride is a white powder, bitter to taste that has an immediate numbing effect when placed on the tip of one's tongue. The most common way of taking the drug is to chop it with a razor blade into a fine powder and snort it via some tube-like implement (a straw, a biro or most often a rolled up bank-note-the higher the denomination the better) into your nose where it dissolves and passes through the nasal membrane into the drug stream - sorry! I mean the blood stream. By the time cocaine gets 'onto the streets' (as the tabloids would have it) it has been 'cut' with so many other things to increase it's bulk and, in doing so, decreasing its potency, that some people will dissolve the additives with solvents leaving a supposedly pure cocaine base which can be smoked either in a pipe or off silver paper in the same way that heroin users will 'chase the dragon'. Freebasing is an effective, if fiddly way of administering the drug.

Like speed (see GT 5) cocaine is a psychoactive stimulant that gives the user an exhilerating 'high' feeling along with a boost in confidence, intelligence, physical potency and sexual libido. Speed tends to drag the user to this feeling of exhileration, then after several hours of intensity it drops you with a thud. Cocaine is to speed what a Cadillac is to a Marina - they both get you where you want to go but with one you get a smoother ride! The initial hit from cocaine seldom lasts longer than three minutes and after an hour it has totally tapered off. For this reason habitual coke snorters will have a 'line' every twenty minutes or so to maintain the intensity of the drug.

For those who inject cocaine the effect can vary from making them want to vomit to what has been described as 'total body orgasm'. In either case the initial 'rush' as the blood carries the drug through the brain lasts little longer than it takes to pump in the solution - from then on you might as well have snorted it! After virtually any dose of coke there is the inevitable comedown which manifests itself in various degrees of tiredness, hunger and meloncholy.

There are many myths about cocaine which need to be dispelled. Because it is expensive (around £70 per gram) it is assumed to be proportionally more potent than amphetamines. This is not the case. In many ways speed is a much stronger drug that effects you for longer, hits'you harder and does more damage to you both mentally and physically. One of the biggest fallacies surrounding cocaine is its apparent ability to make dithering junkies out of anyone who so much as sniffs a few grains. Cocaine does not invoke

physical dependency and is of relatively low toxicity in comparision to opiates or barbs, What happens with prolonged use of the drug is that the user can develop paranoia, agitation, confusion and mood swings as well as unusual sleep patterns but then there aren't many people who don't suffer from these symptoms anyway!

One of the most interesting things about cocaine is that your body will not build up a tolerance to the drug that requires you to increase subsequent doses. In fact there is a reverse tolerance syndrome whereby the body increases its sensitivity to the drug with

requiar use,

Yet cocaine, especially in high doses (particulary when injected or freebased) does present a toxicity problem which does not occur with speed (the drug with which coke is most often compared). Coke has a depressant effect on the lower brain centres which control, amongst other things, respiration. With a low to moderate dose the higher centres of the brain are stimulated but with large doses (or with susceptible people) the low brain centres begin triggering tremors and convulsions. Confusion, a dry throat and dizziness may set in whilst breathing becomes erratic, fluctuating between shallow breaths and large gulps. The heart beat also becomes arrhythmic and it is possible for the individual to die of either a heart attack or respiratory failure. Because of the frantic puffing that manifests itself during one of these episodes it has been called 'The Casey Jones Reaction'

Cocaine, then, is a drug which is basically overpriced, over- rated and over here. However it is also a whole bundle of fun; for those who can afford it I thoroughly reccommend getting through a few dozen lines - one every 15 mins - whilst enjoying oneself at a pleasurable social do such as the Gallic Feast!

(14). During 1971 the IRA in 'Derry invented the Durex Bomb -Sulphuric acid sealed in a phial of candlewax, placed inside a condom which was then put inside a large, thick envelope with a quantity of sodium chlorate. The bomber places the package at the target, squeezes the phial which releases the acid to eat through the sheath and ignite the chemicals.

(15). Between 1971 and 1972 the Catholic ghetto of Londonderry was unpoliceable (even by the army!) 'Free Derry' as it was known by Republicans was ruled by Martin McGuinness (Commander of the 'Derry IRA) until the army broke through the barricades

in summer '72.

(16). By the Spring of '71 the Provisionals had put forward a plan for a new Ireland (Eire Nua). This proposed a federal state based on the four ancient provinces of Ireland. Ulster, Munster, Leinster and Connaught. Dail Uladh (Parliament of Ulster) would cover the 6 counties of N.Ireland (Antrim, Armagh, Derry, Down, Fermanagh and Tyrone) plus their neighbours to the south and west, Cavan, Monaghan and Donegal. This would even up the demographic odds against the Catholics while still leaving the Protestants in the majority. "Dail Uladh would be representative of Catholic and Protestant, Orange and Green, Left and Right. It would be an Ulster parliament for the Ulster people."

(17). In 1974 there was another split in the IRA this time creating the Irish Republican Socialist Party (IRSP) and their

military wing the Irish National Liberation Army (INLA).

(18). 'Noraid' - the fund raising US wing of the IRA was sending \$600,000 a year during the early part of the conflict. By the mid-seventies this figure had dropped to \$160,000, during the Hunger-Strikes this figure leapt to \$800,000 but soon afterwards fell back to \$300,000 (according to Martin Galvin, chief executive of Noraid). Approx 50% of IRA funds come from

(19). The IRA's policing of Catholic ghettos breaks down into 3 categories: petty crime - punished by a warning or some sort of useful 'Social work' such as cleaning the homes of old people; Serious crime (Armed robbery, rape) - punished by wounding, often 'Graded' knee-capping, being shot through the back of the legs with a small calibre pistol (Some were mere stigma shots, through the fleshy part of the thighs!); And finally informing on or defrauding the IRA - punishable by death!

(20). Since 1969 approx 2,700 people have been killed in the 'Troubles' - 300 IRA, 400 Soldiers, 250 Police and 180 Ulster Defence Regiment. The remaining 1,500 were Catholic Protestant civilians!
